Autism spectrum disorder - BMA

Suspect autism spectrum disorder (ASD) in a preschool child if any of the following signs and symptoms are consistently present across different settings: Language delay or regression, unusual characteristics of spoken language, or reduced or infrequent use of language (assessed using the child's first language if they are multilingual), for example:
