In the Central Rocky Mountains, trees and shrubs make their home in a patchwork of forests and meadows between 5500 ft. and 11500 ft. (1650 m.-3450 m.). Different ecosystems in the park support particular species depending on elevation, precipitation, and aspect (the steepness and direction of the slope). In the harsh mountain environment only evergreen trees, a few hardy deciduous trees and strong adaptive shrubs can thrive.

Aspen then start to grow in these open, sunny areas and lodgepole pine trees populate open, burned areas. Eventually, these trees create too much shade for their seedlings to survive and are succeeded by ponderosa pine, Engelmann Spruce, Douglas Fir or Subalpine fir at varying elevations. A mixture of all of these plants forms a climax vegetation that will stand over time unless disrupted by natural disturbances such as avalanches, wind storms, floods or climate change.

Kuchler U.S. Potential natural vegetation Types, Rocky Mountain National Park encompasses three classifications; an Alpine tundra & Barren (52) vegetation type with an Alpine tundra (11) vegetation form, a Western Spruce/Fir (15) vegetation type with a Rocky Mountain Conifer Forest (3) vegetation form, and a Pine/Douglas fir (18) vegetation type with a Rocky Mountain Conifer Forest (3) vegetation form.

\If you come up to the park you'll notice on both the east and west side of the park a lot of dead trees,\ says Paul McLaughlin, an ecologist at Rocky Mountain National Park. \Those trees have been largely impacted by bark beetles and more recently spruce beetles. Both are species that are native to the forest of Colorado.

The East Troublesome Fire has burned more than 33 square miles in Rocky Mountain National Park, but the Holzwarth Historic Site has remained untouched. Of the 192,574 acres burned by the East Troublesome Fire, 21,307 acres have burned in Rocky. The Cameron Peak Fire has burned an additional 7,485 acres of the 265,769-acre national park.
